## Historic night as Bishop commissions first group of Diocesan Interns

History was made in Southwell & Nottingham when Bishop Paul Williams commissioned the first cohort of interns graduating from the Diocesan Internship Programme. The cohort included nine young leaders who undertook a year of learning, personal development and service with the Diocese's Younger Leadership College.

The College was set up in September 2016, as part of the diocesan vision of Growing Disciples: Wider, Younger, Deeper, and has a vision to equip, resource and commission 1,000 younger leaders over the next seven years. This group of nine interns were among the first young people to get involved.

The commissioning took place during a service at Holy Trinity, Southwell, and was followed by a celebration meal in the Archbishop's Palace. Bishop Paul told the interns, their families, friends and supporters, that it was right to take a moment to thank God for the first year of the intern programme: "We are going to



commission them this evening because it has never been just about this one year – we are going to send them out as they continue to serve God." He said the command to every disciple was "to go into all the world, and this is what tonight is all about – the commissioning is a sending out".

Andy Wolfe, Dean of the College, invited each of the interns to the front of the church: Amelia Delbridge, Tom Tuck, Duncan Dean, Josie Rowland, Joanne Arton, Pippa Scott, Niamh Shewell-Cooper and Iona Loffman; there he presented them with a gift and prayed for them.

Three of the interns, Tom Tuck,

Pippa Scott and Alex Shiells, are now set to start their ordination training, while the others are moving into a range of other exciting leadership contexts

## Arnold St Mary's man awarded British Empire Medal

**A** Reader from St Mary's Church Arnold has been awarded the British Empire Medal.

Eighty year old Alan J W Langton's involvement with the community life of Arnold and Mapperley has earned him the prestigious award, which will be presented to him on 1st September at Nottingham Council House by the Lord-Lieutenant of Nottinghamshire, Sir John Peace, and he will have an invitation to Buckingham Palace for one of the Garden Parties next year.



Alan says: "My professional career was always in teaching, and I taught at Eastwood Hall Park School and Carlton le Willows School, before being appointed to the Headship of South Wolds School at Keyworth in 1981. I retired from this post in 1994 after thirteen very happy years within this village community. At the same time as teaching during the week I was licenced as a Reader in the Diocese of Southwell in 1963, and have continued to serve the parish of Saint Mary's Arnold for fifty four years, and worked with seven different vicars during that time."

In 1986 he was one of a group of men who formed the original Rotary Club of Arnold and Mapperley, where he is still a member. This lively group seeks to address and respond to local issues and local people by helping with money and practical schemes which we feel require additional support. He has also been the local representative for the Leprosy Mission in the area, and helped to help raise large sums of money for this international cause over the last thirty years

"After my retirement from teaching I wished to continue making a contribution to society, especially in the area of Arnold and Mapperley, where I have always lived. I formed the 'Arnold Golden Eagles', a group especially for older citizens where they could find out more about the workings of health and council and social service organisations as they affected their lives. This was a sub-group of the Arnold Area Forum, which I have represented on the county-wide Older People's Advisory Group (OPAG), the object of which is to try

## Bishop of Natal on ten-day visit

Last month, the Bishop of Natal, the Rt Revd Dino Gabriel, arrived in the diocese for a 10-day visit with his wife Elizabeth and the Link Officer in Natal, the Revd Dane Elsworth. They travelled extensively around the diocese, attending the Transform Weekend and Evensong at Southwell Minster as well as meeting chaplains, visiting a school and experiencing the breadth of ministry that stretches from outer estates to the city centre to rural contexts.

On arrival, the group had lunch at the Minster Refectory, before meeting staff at Jubilee House. The Bishop, accompanied by Bishop Paul, visited churches in Nottingham – Trinity Church, in Mansfield Road; St Stephen’s in Hyson Green, and St Nic’s in the city centre.

Part of the visit was to meet those who have ‘small story’ links between parishes – and those who are seeking them.

Bishop Dino has been Bishop of Natal for about 18 months. Bishop Paul visited Natal last year, and this is a return visit. The dioceses are exploring ways to build on the friendship and to broaden and enrich our shared journey of faith.

A Quiet Space in the Heart of Southwell

**Saturday 16th September 2017**

**Walking Pilgrimage to Southwell: Drawing water from the wells of salvation (or Holy wells)**

led by Alison Milbank

From pagan times, springs and wells have been considered to be holy places, and have been visited for healing. After morning prayer at Sacrista, this day will offer an opportunity to walk the paths and lanes between Halloughton and Southwell, and to meditate on the role of water in the actual landscape as well as the spiritual life. We shall visit dew-ponds and the original south well and examine the feature so distinctive of this area: the dumble, which is a stream cutting between steep narrow banks, with a rich plant life.

There will be an opportunity to follow traditional Christian prayer practices at holy wells. Our pilgrimage will end at Southwell Minster, where we shall pray in the chapel on the site of the original holy well and baptistery, and then go on to Sacrista Prebend for afternoon tea. There will be approximately

**B**ishop Tony Porter will be taking part in the second CEO Sleepout at Meadow Lane on 5th October.

He will be joined by club owner Alan Hardy and other business and community leaders who will sleep at the side of the pitch to raise money for the homeless.

Notts County Football in the Community is leading the project in partnership with the Trent Bridge Community Trust; last year 80 people slept out at Meadow Lane and raised £46,000.

West Bridgford's The Friary, a drop-in centre for homeless and unemployed people, and Emmanuel House support centre on Goosegate, will be the project's beneficiaries this year.

CEO Sleepout is a charity set up to fight homelessness and poverty. It raises money by encouraging executives to sleep outdoors for one night and to raise sponsorship from their business contacts and friends.

## Visitors from the Diocese of Jerusalem

**F**ather Fadi Diab and four ambassadors from the Diocese of Jerusalem will be visiting Southwell & Nottingham in October.

Fr Fadi Diab is a Palestinian parish priest from Ramallah (West Bank). He is a founder member of the Youth Connection for Peace Programme, member of the Palestinian-Israeli Theologians Forum and the Palestine Advisory Council of the Episcopal Peace Fellowship. He has presented workshops to the World Council of Churches on the theological understanding of the Palestinian-Israeli Conflict.

He is accompanied by Marwan Durzi who is the Head of Palestinian Prime ministers Office for Area C (62% of the West Bank). He has over 20 years experience of state building in the Office of the President and Negotiations Affairs Department of the PLO.

They have a busy itinerary that will see them taking part in events across the diocese, sharing their experiences of life in a troubled, but fascinating part of the world.

## First commissioning of younger leaders on mentoring programme

The first commissioning of the Younger Leadership College Sector Mentoring programme has taken place.

The programme partners mentors from various sectors of work with young adults studying or just starting out in their careers. The first cohort saw 23 young adults meeting with 15 mentors from a range of sectors including science and engineering, medicine, TV and radio, journalism, teaching, business and finance, creative business and entrepreneurship to help young potential leaders understand and apply their faith to the contexts they are working in.

The scheme has been set up and run by the Younger Leadership College, an initiative set up by the diocese to develop 1,000 younger leaders, resourced, equipped and commissioned to fulfil their God-given calling in society and in the Church.

Mark Greene, Executive Director of the London Institute of Contemporary Christianity, was at the commissioning. He praised the scheme for being the first of its kind in the UK and said: “Here is an opportunity for a young person to not only be taught and focus on some really helpful biblical material that gives them a framework for thinking about their daily work, but also a way to engage with experienced people who have walked that walk with God for many years and have wisdom to bring from their own experience and encouragement and prayer.”

Bishop Paul Williams prayed for and commissioned the young adults who had been mentored during the programme.

The next cohort of the Sector Mentoring Scheme will start in October 2017. ## Journey in Faith Course 2017/18

Each year we welcome a new cohort of students to the ‘Journey in Faith’ (JiF) course.
