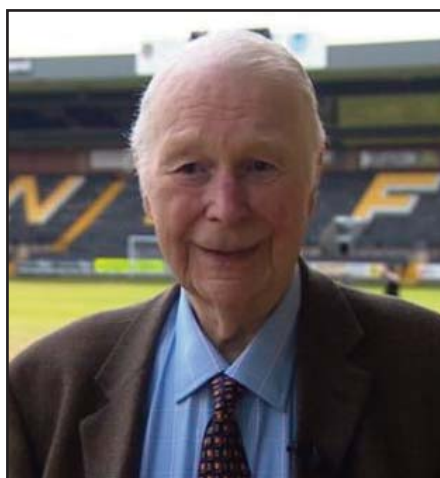

Searching for the truth

BBC Radio Nottingham's Colin Slater has announced that he is stepping back from commentating duties but will continue as the Notts County correspondent for the broadcaster.

Colin, who worships at Christ Church, Chilwell, has covered more than 2,500 Notts County matches in a remarkable career. Here he describes how his Christian faith influences his work as a journalist:



“The greatest obligation on all who work in the world of the mass media is to strive always to report the truth. That is a special responsibility on those of us who are also Christians. It isn't always as easy as perhaps it sounds. I know that from having spent a working lifetime in media work, 16 years in newspapers, over 20 heading up the public relations services of two major public authorities and, simultaneously, broadcasting on sport for the BBC.

“Why should it be so fraught with difficult challenges? Mostly because the facts behind stories are seldom black and white but are nuanced in a variety of ways. That usually requires a lot of ‘digging’ to try to ensure one has got all angles covered.

“I was extremely blessed to spend my formative years under the guidance and influence of an editor who was also a Christian. Whenever we made a mistake in the weekly newspaper of which he had charge, and on which he gave me my first chance in the

New chaplain to the fire service

The Revd David Milner says he feels “privileged and excited” about his new role as chaplain to Notts Fire and Rescue Service.

He took over from the Venerable Robin Turner at the beginning of April after being asked by Bishop Tony Porter to consider taking on the job.

“My aim is to visit every fire station within my first 12 months, though it will take longer to meet all the personnel as they will be on different watches. It is a great privilege to take on this role. I have already visited a number of stations, and have attended a passing out parade at Ollerton.”

As part of his role, David will make himself available to staff who want to talk to someone in confidence, working at all levels of the service, from the chiefs at fire headquarters to the men and women on the ground.

He might also be asked to attend major incidents to be available to firefighters and other people at the scene: “I won’t be rolling out any hoses, I’ll be keeping out of the way but being there for anyone who wants to talk or needs some support.”

During his station visits he has been made to feel very welcome: “Goodness knows what they really think but they have been fantastic – I am always offered a cup of tea.”

David, who is Priest in Charge at Farndon with Thorpe, Hawton and Cotham, is soon to retire but will continue as chaplain in his retirement.

profession, we apologised in the very next issue and the correction was carried in a prominent position.

“I learned “on the job” with him as my mentor whereas today young people seeking a career in journalism, whether print or broadcast, are unlikely to be offered employment unless they have graduated on a media course run by many of our universities across the country. They also have to contend with many matters which are much more complex than in my early days.

“We should rejoice as a nation that we have a free Press which, for all its faults, serves us well - especially when it is committed to acquainting its readers or listeners with the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth.”

Colin, who is an elected member of General Synod, and a member of Bishop’s Council and the diocesan finance committee, was inducted into the Notts County Hall of Fame in 2014 as part of his 80th birthday celebrations.

Friends, colleagues and surprise guests gathered to mark the occasion in the 1862 Suite at Meadow Lane. Former Notts personalities, including Howard Wilkinson, Don Masson, Les Bradd, Steve Cherry, Mick Jones, Tommy Johnson and Ian Richardson attended to pay tribute to Colin.

Archbishop visits Diocesan Synod

The Archbishop of the Province of South East Asia paid a visit to Southwell & Nottingham’s Diocesan Synod on Saturday; he was welcomed by Bishop Paul and in his response said he was excited by the diocese’s vision for Growing Disciples wider younger deeper.

Archbishop Ng Moon Hing, is in the UK for ten days to chair two Anglican Communion meetings held in London on intentional discipleship. He said: “It was very exciting to hear about the plans for growing disciples. It is good to be here and to hear about plans for growth.”

He was visiting Synod with his friend the Revd Canon Richard Kirton, who once taught the Archbishop at theological college in Malaysia.

As Archbishop of South East Asia he is responsible for the Church’s work in Brunei, Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia Nepal, , Singapore, Thailand and Vietnam.

Richard said before he became a Bishop, his friend had been a parish priest for 20 years at St Peter’s Ipoh, Malaysia and was renowned for re-establishing and planting many church plants in villages in the area. When he was made Bishop of West Malaysia, a title he still holds, the former Archbishop of Canterbury Rowan Williams came to Kuala Lumpur and preached at his consecration.

Archbishops' pastoral letter on the General Election

The Archbishops have issued a Pastoral Letter relating to the General Election that encourages Christians to pray for those standing for office, and to continue to pray for those who are elected.

They also say that “our second obligation as Christians at these times is to set aside apathy and cynicism and to participate, and encourage others to do the same. At a practical level that could mean putting on a hustings event for candidates, volunteering for a candidate, or simply making sure to vote on Thursday 8th June. The Christian virtues of love, trust and hope should guide and judge our actions, as well as the actions and policies of all those who are seeking election to the House of Commons and to lead our country.

“This election is being contested against the backdrop of deep and profound questions of identity. Opportunities to renew and reimagine our shared values as a country and a United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland only come around every few generations. We are in such a time.

“Our Christian heritage, our current choices and our obligations to future generations and to God’s world will all play a shaping role. If our shared British values are to carry the weight of where we now stand and the challenges ahead of us, they must have at their core cohesion, courage and stability.”

The Archbishop and Richard met in 1981; Richard had travelled to Malaysia in 1976 to help open a seminary. There was already a tiny Anglican College but in 1979 an ecumenical seminary (Anglicans, Methodists and Lutherans) was opened with Richard as the Dean of Studies. The Archbishop was one of his students.

While in the UK for the discipleship conferences, organised by the Anglican Communion, the Archbishop visited his friend and they took the opportunity to visit some of the well-known attractions in Nottinghamshire, including Southwell Minster. He also celebrated and preached at St Peter and St Paul, Warsop where Angela Fletcher is Vicar, and where Richard now lives.

The Archbishop already knew Bishop Paul and dropped in at Synod so they could talk together over lunch.

'Foliage, Flowers and Fantasy' come to the Cathedral

The NSBA, (Northern Society for Botanical Art), are staging an Exhibition of Botanical Art, entitled, Foliage, Flowers and Fantasy, which will be on display in the Chapter House at Southwell Cathedral, Southwell, Nottinghamshire, from Saturday 17th June until Friday 14th July 2017. A preview evening, by invitation, will also take place on the Friday 16th June.

Some of the art on display will be inspired by the plants and creatures in the stone carvings in the Chapter House and elsewhere. Members use various media including graphite to produce monotone work, and coloured pencils, watercolour, acrylic, gouache (opaque watercolour) and pastel. One new member

Chapter House exhibition as this has included 'fantastic' creatures and green men as well as foliage and flowers! Plants depicted in the carvings include oak, rose, ivy, berries and fruit. Exhibited work includes single subjects as well as larger more complex compositions.
